



MTI Dedication Dinner - A Historic Evening

On June 16th, three hundred gathered at the Ritz-Carlton in St. Louis, MO, for Missouri Torah Institute's Dedication Dinner.

Guests traveled from around the country to celebrate this milestone with the yeshiva. Visitors included HaRav Akiva Grunblatt, Rosh Yeshiva of Yeshivas Chofetz Chaim in Queens, Rabbi Aaron Kotler from Bais Medrash Govoha in Lakewood, Rabbi Boruch Neuberger from Ner Yisroel in Baltimore, Rabbi Yitzchok Ehrman of Agudath Israel Midwest Region, and Rabbi Bunny Freedman from Detroit.

After being treated to divrei bracha delivered by HaRav Grunblatt, shlita, the evening opened with the recognition and celebration of the dedication of the Deutsch Family Campus, made possible by Mr. Charles and Mrs. Naomi Ruth Deutsch, pillars of the community, who are proud and staunch supporters of MTI. The state-of-theart spacious campus—previously a school for the deaf—includes

a dorm, gym, basketball court, music room, and art room, giving talmidim a wide range of wholesome outlets outside the classroom. A master builder, Mr. Deutsch challenged the yeshiva to dream big, and then helped that dream become a reality. The new building has enabled the yeshiva to build and grow in ways that were otherwise unimaginable. A video recognizing the Deutsches for their contributions to MTI and to the community included divrei bracha from Harav HaGaon Rav Shmuel Kamenetsky, shlita, and HaRav Dovid Harris, shlita, as well as marbitzei Torah from around the globe.

MTI also celebrated the naming of the Fox Family High School by Ambassador Sam and Mrs. Marilyn Fox in memory of their son, Greg Fox, a"h. Ambassador Fox, a successful businessman of world renown and the former Ambassador to Belgium, has developed a

Senior Shabbos & Graduation 2019

A good time was had by all at the Senior Shabbos. In addition to our local families, parents and relatives journeyed from Overland Park, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Queens, Buffalo Grove, and Brooklyn to spend a special Shabbos together in the Chesterfield TICK community that culminated with the emotional graduation on Sunday.

Proud parents commented about the achdus and friendships the boys displayed and the enthusiasm that they had. One parent remarked, "The Senior Shabbos was an amazing way to finish the four incredible years at MTI." Another parent commented that she loved seeing "a little window into the MTI yeshiva experience and [spending time with] the people who have been so involved in helping us raise our son into a fine ben Torah."

In their speeches at the graduation, many of the boys spoke about their close kesher with their rebbeim, and how much they gained from their guidance. In addition, the graduates made a point to thank their classmates for the friendships they had created during their years together. This unplanned gesture showed the unique achdus among

Prior to handing out the diplomas, Rabbi Wachsman shared some personal impressions of all the graduates and concluded with a customized bracha reflecting the desire for each young man to capitalize on his unique strengths to serve Hashem and develop as a ben Torah. He praised this year's graduating class' achdus and camaraderie, and the way they displayed tremendous sensitivity towards one another and ensured that everyone was included and involved in activities, class fundraisers, and trips.

Rabbi Gewirtz gave an inspirational speech about trying to emulate Shevet Levi, who made the choice to draw Hashem close by consciously choosing the right path. He expressed his pride that the seniors showed impressive growth in Torah learning, and also took more AP exams this year than any previous year. "What stands out in my mind when I think about you," he said to the graduates, "is your desire to succeed and your determination to do what it takes to achieve success."

The MTI Bais Medrash's sixth summer zman in the San Fernando Valley is once again providing a great boost in ruchniyus for the talmidim. Rabbi Avroham Goldman commented that "this zman, everyone is full of achdus and energy for learning. What makes it so special is the synergy of our current talmidim with the alumni who have joined especially for this program."

Mr. Jonathan Istrin, a Valley native and a close friend of the yeshiva, devotes much time and effort into arranging this exceptional program every summer. He initiated this great program to strengthen the Torah learning in the Valley and to help the boys enjoy a productive summer zman.

After finishing their school year in June, the bais medrash students

are enjoying a bonus zman of a few weeks, with a change of scenery in a different state and with chavrusas from among the Valley community. The bachurim learn Maseches Kesuvos b'iyun in the mornings and b'kiyus in the afternoons at Valley Torah High School. In the evenings, they learn during night seder with community members at Shaarey Zedek Congregation and at the new Valley Village Community Kollel.

The students of MTI bring another level of intense Torah learning to the Valley community, and the community reciprocates with extensive hachnosas orchim, including hosting Shabbos meals, onegs, and housing the boys. We thank the entire community for inviting the yeshiva into their homes (and swimming pools!) and providing such a conducive environment to Torah growth.



Spending the Yom Tov of Shavuos together at MTI is always a major highlight of the year. Nearly all of the rebbeim and their families stay in the yeshiva and generate a special and uplifting ruach of Torah throughout Yom Tov. We hope that the students have a relaxing summer and look forward to greeting them next year for continued growth.


